

## Note from the Pastor




Since Ash Wednesday was in February and Easter is in April all of the month of March falls into the season of Lent. Looking back into the past there have been times of very specific and strict requirements about observing the season. As time has passed, the rules and the practices have gradually relaxed. And now we're left with a vague notion that we really should do something different as we prepare for Easter. But what?

First, let's ask, "why?". Right now, neither the church nor our society are requiring, or even pressuring us to all do anything at all, so why would we? We can choose to because this can be a time of deeper self-understanding and more purposeful discipleship which we offer to God to be used for the purposes of God's Kingdom. That is consistent with the ancient practices of the church, and it is still our calling as disciples of Jesus Christ.

What then? What works best for you? What keeps you faithful in prayer, and how can you extend that practice for this season? Maybe set aside more times to pray, or pray with and for a partner, or choose something special to pray about? Should you give something up? Will it help you focus on Christ, or be more generous? Then by all means do it. If you choose a Lenten practice thoughtfully and prayerfully, with a purpose your life will give shape to our prayer, "Thy Kingdom Come".

At work in the world of Victor Hugo's *The Grace of Les Misérables* through the season of Lent.

In the six-week study *The Grace of Les Misérables*, author and pastor Matt Rawle dives into six ideals found in the story—grace, justice, poverty, revolution, love, and hope—each represented by a character in Hugo's story. As these imperfect and relatable characters interact, we can see how these ideals work together (perhaps even in spite of each other)

out in the world. In keeping with his previous works, Matt Rawle brings us to the intersection of Church and Pop Culture by drawing parallels between the iconic story and musical and our Christian calling, inspiring us to both understand our faith and live it out in the world. The study will meet on Wednesday at noon in the parlor; February 18, 25, March 4, 11, 18, & 25. Please consider joining the study and inviting your friends. We welcome everyone who is interested, from the church and from the community.


Some of the topics we'll cover include:

## Wesley Church Scholarship Program

Wesley Church would like to award a college scholarship to an active Wesley Church member for the fall of 2026.

If you are an active member of Wesley Church and will be enrolled in an institution of higher learning this fall, please contact the church office at 678-9626 to apply for a scholarship form, or you can pick up one from the bin on the office door.

Or give your name, e-mail address and telephone number to the office and we will e-mail you the application form which will outline the requirements.

**The deadline to turn in applications is April 1, 2026.**

The three-member selection committee, which has been appointed by the Trustees, will notify the recipient(s) by May 15, 2026.

REQUIREMENTS: The applicant must be:

- 1) A regularly attending participant at Wesley UMC, and
- 2) Pursuing a career in full-time Christian service, or
- 3) Pursuing a career in a "helping" profession (nursing, teaching, social work, and childcare are examples), or
- 4) Pursuing an undergraduate degree or a post high school education, or
- 5) Pursuing an advanced degree, or
- 6) First-time recipient of this scholarship (preferred) or
- 7) Repeat recipient (acceptable).

The applicant will be judged on the following, in order of importance:

- 1) An essay that explains how the applicant has been inspired to pursue major career or field of study,
- 2) Christian service at Wesley United Methodist Church,
- 3) School and/or community service, and
- 4) Academic success.

If none of the applicants meet all requirements, the selection committee may elect to waive the career requirement and award a scholarship to the resulting superior compliant applicant.


## Search Class





*Thank you to EVERYONE who supported our Christmas Cafe! We made the same amount as last year!! \$1074.*


